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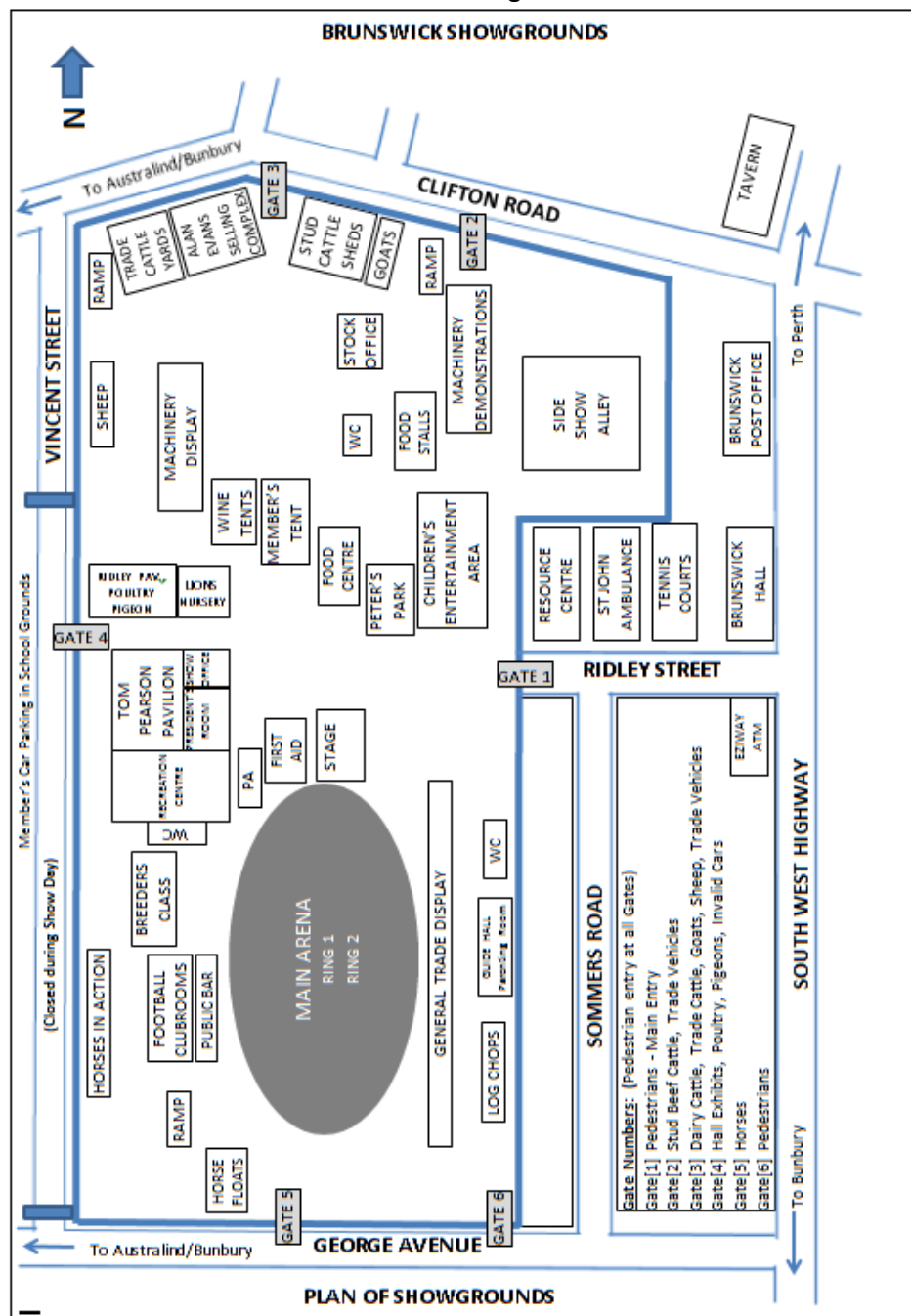
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## Brunswick Showgrounds

# The President's Trophy

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## President: Robert George

- The President's Trophy is awarded to the exhibitor who accumulates the highest number of points in one, or a combination of the sections;  
Stud Cattle, Horses (breeding), Goats, Trade Cattle and Trade Lambs.
  - The only classes which will carry points in the respective sections;  
**Stud Cattle** Single pen classes excluding type and utility special classes, group classes, special awards and special prizes and the beef classic.  
**Horses** All breeding classes excluding Ridden and Group Classes.  
**Goats** All classes excluding progeny and group classes.  
**Trade Cattle** All classes.  
**Trade Lamb** Live judging only (excludes Trade Lamb Carcass).  
Exhibits receive points once only.
  - Points will be allotted as follows:  
**1<sup>st</sup>** - 3 points, **2<sup>nd</sup>** - 2 points, **3<sup>rd</sup>** - 1 point. Champion – 2 points)
  - Points will not be allotted unless at least two exhibitors participate in each class, except in the event of the animal going on to win a championship in competition in which case points will be awarded for the original class in which the animal competed.
  - Exhibits entered must have been bred or produced by the exhibitor or owned and domiciled at the owner's property for a minimum of six months.
- 

- **Pearson Pavilion Trophy**  
Charlie Chapple Perpetual Memorial Trophy awarded to the exhibitor gaining the highest number of overall points in the Tom Pearson Pavilion. To be eligible the exhibitor must have competed in more than one section.
  - **Ridley Pavilion Trophy**  
Awarded to the exhibitor gaining the highest number of overall points in the Poultry Section.

The Members and Committee of the Brunswick Agricultural Society (Inc.) wish to sincerely thank sponsors for their cash and trophy donations. The success of the show relies heavily on this support. We hope that all those associated with the show will continue their support in the future.

# Rules and Regulations

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The Regulations of The Royal Agricultural Society (Inc.) shall apply to this show except where otherwise stated.

- Every exhibit, except livestock, must be grown by or be the work of the exhibitor and exhibitor may be called to make an affidavit to that effect.
- The Committee reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving reason for doing so.
- The Judges may withhold prizes for such exhibits as they deem unworthy.
- Should only two exhibits be shown in any one class, no second prize will be awarded, unless in the opinion of the judge such exhibit could have gained a prize had there been a further competition.
- No appeal against the decision of the judges will be entertained unless made in writing before 4pm on show day and a deposit of \$20.00 will be lodged. Appeal to be lodged at the secretary's office.
- Livestock exhibits must not be removed until after the grand parade and Produce not before 5pm on the day of the show and then only by permission from the stewards.
- Stud stock must be registered with their breed societies and must be Brucellosis and Tuberculosis free, stud beef must be correctly tattooed for inspection on the showgrounds. Stud dairy cattle registration certificates must be available on show day.
- Any person insulting or interfering with the Judges during the show will be subject to removal from the showground and the prize (if any) awarded to such person may be absolutely forfeited to the society.
- Attendants in charge of exhibits in horse, cattle and sheep sections are asked to remain in attendance until the judging in their respective classes is completed.
- Every reasonable care must be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the society. Ordinary precautions will be taken to guard against fire or theft to protect the property of the society and the exhibitor. The society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through an exhibitor and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the society blameless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from such accident.
- Persons contravening any of the society's rules or regulations forfeit any prizes which may be awarded them.

All entries must be accompanied by photocopies of horse's registration and a current breed membership. All monies must be paid before judging starts.

Car parking is on a very limited basis and WILL BE DIRECTED by Parking Attendants.  
Competitors are strongly encouraged to come prepared to utilize the stables available or make sure they are able to tie to the tail gate of the horse float. Stallions must not be tied to the float or vehicle. Please use stables or float for safety of stallion.

**You are responsible for cleaning your own stable or tie up area.** Bins will be provided.

Stallions and Colts must be shown in suitable headgear and handlers must be over 18 years. When not competing, they are to be restrained **IN** your float or in a stable allocated by the society. **No exceptions.** We strongly advise that all stallions wear a **GREEN** disc and that all exhibitors be aware and respectful to the stallions on the grounds.

Exhibitors having a horse/s in more than one ring being judged simultaneously, must elect in which class they will compete.

Please remember the Stewards and Pencillers are Volunteers, it is your responsibility to know which classes you have entered and be ready to enter your class when called.

If the Judges or Stewards see any signs of abuse towards a horse or pony, the judge may ask the exhibitor to leave the ring and all entries monies will be forfeited.

No appeal against the decision of the judges will be entertained unless made in writing and a fee of \$50.00 lodged. Appeal to be lodged within one hour of said event to the Steward's tent.

Society's Ribbons will be awarded to Champion and Reserve Champion Stallion, Mare and Gelding in each subsection up to 'Supreme of Supreme'.

## **Inspector Bee - Honey Judges Presenting your Honey for Judging**



In judging, the care the exhibitor takes in presenting their honey for judging is the most critical factor. All honey entries will be donated to Vinnies Food Bank, following the competition.

A scorecard for extracted honey consists of:

1. Container appearance;
2. Density, moisture content above 18.6% is disqualified;
3. Freedom from crystals, suspended particles e.g. pollen and bubbles;
4. Cleanliness and freedom from foam and foreign matter e.g. wax, lint, foam and body parts;
5. Flavour and Aroma.

Helpful hints for jar presentation:

- To gain the maximum points, it is recommended that the honey is presented in a straight sided jar which when filled to correct fill line weighs 500 g (plus jar) and is sealed with the correct fitting black lid.  
The jar/honey will be weighed - 500 g honey.
- Jar should be clean, with no labelling.
- Ensure all fingerprints are removed from jar.
- Ensure inside of lid is clean and clear of honey.
- Secure lid but not so tight that it is difficult to undo. • Before submitting wear cotton gloves, polish the jar and lid to remove all fingerprints. Ensure jar is kept upright to prevent honey from touching lid.
- When submitting jar for judging wear gloves or handle only by the lid.
- Registrar will handle your jar with gloves when numbering so as not to contaminate your entry.



## Inspector Bee - Honey Judges Presenting your Beeswax for Judging



In judging beeswax, the care the exhibitor takes in preparing the wax for judging is the most critical factor.

The total score of 100 points is made up of:

- |  |    |
|--|----|
| • Cleanliness  | 20 |
| • Uniformity of Appearance / correct candle bottom and wick finish | 20 |
| • Colour   | 20 |
| • Aroma  | 20 |
| • Absence of cracks and shrinkage                                  | 20 |

Helpful hints for presentation:

- Capping wax provides ideal wax for blocks and candles. Colour is important.
- Do not over heat beeswax, as it will lose its aroma. Overheating will also cause shrinkage upon cooling.
- Cool blocks of beeswax and candles slowly to minimise cracking.
- Very slow, even cooling gives a flat topped block rather than the wavy surface that open-air cooling gives.
- Only take wax for the mould from the top layer in the melting pot.
- Strain beeswax through old T-shirt material, rough side up. This will remove debris.
- Candle bottoms and wicks should be finished correctly.
- Wrap blocks of beeswax products, such as candles, immediately upon finishing to prevent specks of dirt adhering and scratching.
- Baking paper is a suitable wrapping material.

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## ■ Section I - Cooking Recipe – South African Milk Tart

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### Ingredients:

#### Sucre Patee (Pastry Crust)

- 1 1/2 cups Plain flour
- 1/3 cup icing sugar
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 128gms very cold (or frozen) unsalted butter, cut into small pieces
- 1 large egg yolk

#### Milk filling

- 2 1/4 cups milk
- 30gms butter
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 2 tablespoons cornflour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- ½ tablespoon vanilla extract
- ½ tablespoon almond extract
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon nutmeg or replace with cinnamon

### South African Milk Tart (Melttert)



### Instructions:

#### Pastry Crust

1. Butter a 9-inch pie pan with a removable bottom. Set aside.
2. Place flour, salt and sugar in a food processor pulse for a couple of times to mix ingredients.
3. Add butter and pulse until rough dough forms.
4. Add egg a little at a time - pulse until the dough barely comes together.
5. Remove dough place on a work surface - knead just enough to incorporate all the dough. Working the dough as little as possible.
6. When it's ready, the dough will be barely moistened and come together into a ball.
7. Lightly press the dough into the prepared pie pan until the bottom and sides are fully covered with pastry.
8. Place pie pan in the freezer and freeze for at least 30 minutes or more this helps prevent the dough from rising.
9. Preheat oven to 200 degrees C.
10. Bake crust for about 20 to 25 minutes or until the crust is dry and golden browned. Set aside.

#### Milk Filling

1. Place saucepan over medium heat, add butter, nutmeg and milk -bring to a boil and remove from the heat.
2. In another bowl, mix together flour, cornflour, sugar, vanilla and almond extract- whisk in eggs until smooth. Gently whisk into the saucepan making sure there are no lumps.
3. Return the pan to the heat – keep stirring constantly until it starts to bubble.
4. Cook for 5-6 minutes. Remove from heat and pour mixture into the baked pastry shell Sprinkle with cinnamon. Chill until ready to be served.

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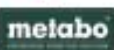
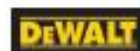

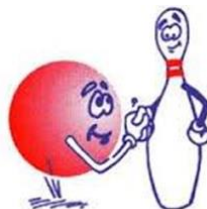

## ■ Section O – Children's Recipes

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### Meringues

- Whites of 4 eggs
- ¼ teaspoon cream of tartar or 1 teaspoon vinegar
- Flavouring
- 8 tablespoons castor sugar

Beat whites stiffly.

Add sugar half tablespoon at a time. Beat well.

Add cream of tartar and flavouring. Beat well.

Place in teaspoon heaps on baking paper.

Bake in a very slow oven about 2 hours.

When cooked store for use as required.



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### Salt Dough

- 1 ½ cups plain flour
- ½ cup fine table salt
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 2/3 cup chilled water

Preheat oven to 120° C.

Line 2 baking trays with baking paper.

Mix flour and salt in a bowl. Make a well in the centre.

Pour in oil. Gradually add water, stirring mixture with a wooden spoon until combined.

Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface.

Knead to make a smooth ball then create item. Place item on trays and bake for 2 ½ hours or until firm and dry. Cool on wire rack.

**Example:** Christmas hanging items. Roll dough out between 2 sheets baking paper until 7mm thick, use shaped cutters to cut and skewer to make a hole at the top. After cooked and cooled use acrylic paint to paint item while wet can sprinkle with glitter.

Thread ribbon to hang.
