Stewards would appreciate where possible rose specimens to be named for public identification only. Roses must be shown without buds. All buds should be clipped off very close to stem.

A bowl must be equal to or greater in width than in height and the mouth at its shortest measure must be at least two-thirds of the width. Entrants must supply their own flower containers. Each specimen and cut to be in individual containers.

Novices "winning the most points in the Novice Section in 2 consecutive years" upgrades you to Open Floral Art, Vase or Bowl Sections. You can no longer enter in the Novice Section.

**Ownership of Exhibits:** In all decorated classes, grasses are not to be used for foliage unless stated. A vase must be greater in height than width.

Entries cannot be removed at any time prior to 5pm show day Saturday 26th October.

All entries to be removed between 5pm and 5:30pm Saturday 26th on production of claim cards.

## Helpful Hints for exhibitors:

- Cake rack marks must not be in evidence, use a folded cloth over cake cooler.
- Lamingtons should be made from Butter Cake.
- No icing or sugar dusting unless stipulated.
- All Biscuits and Cakes un-iced, unless stipulated in Schedule.
- Scones, base free from flour.
- Line cake tins carefully.
- No artificial cherries in mixed fruit, replace with glace cherries.
- Jars for preserves, must be clear and identified, filling approximately 1cm from top. Lids must be in pristine condition. Check for mould spots on preserve before entering. Please break the seal on all jars before delivering.
- Plastic bags and display plates will be provided by the society. Cooking may be displayed on plain paper/plastic bags and cake plates.
- All exhibits available for collection at 5pm only on production of claim tickets.
